



Engaging in a conspiracy to light a fire!





In Reading Magic, children's author Mem Fox describes her experience of reading

Who Sank the Boat? to a three-year old boy she had just met. With both lying side by side on the floor and Mem excitedly using silly voices and saying, "Oh, look!", the two of them ended up rolling on the floor laughing. What a marvelous shared experience!

Some of the books we order, like Who Sank the Boat, are laugh out loud funny, or at least lead to shared giggling. Others are more serious, designed to comfort a child and also to inspire empathy and kindness.

In The Rabbit Listened by Cori Doerrfield, when Taylor's block castle is destroyed by a flock of crows, "Taylor doesn't know where to turn. All the animals are sure they have the answer. The chicken wants to

talk it out, but Taylor doesn't feel like chatting. The bear thinks Taylor should get angry, but that's not quite right either. One by one, the animals try to tell Taylor how to act, and one by one they fail to offer comfort. Then the rabbit arrives. All the rabbit does is listen . . . which is just what Taylor

needs." (Dial Books For Young Readers)

Mem Fox explains that sharing books with children is a way of engaging in a conspiracy with them. She writes,

"The fire of literacy is created by the

emotional sparks between a child, a book, and the person reading. It isn't achieved by the book alone, nor by the child alone, nor by the adult who's reading aloud—it's the relationship winding between all three, bringing them together in easy harmony."


